BASIC HAZARDOUS MATERIALS FOR HAZ MAT EMPLOYEES

This training helps you comply with DOT's requirement that new Haz Mat employees require training within 90 days of being hired and every 3 years thereafter.

What we cover: The Haz Mat Regulations, the Hazmat Table, marking, labeling, placarding, shipping papers, emergency response info, function-specific, safety and security awareness training.

REASONABLE SUSPICION DRUG & ALCOHOL TRAINING FOR DRIVER SUPERVISORS

DOT regulations specifically require “all persons designated to supervise drivers” to receive 60 minutes of mandatory training on alcohol misuse and 60 minutes on controlled substances use. (49CFR §382.603) This DOT-required training shows supervisors what to look for when determining reasonable suspicion. This training illustrates a variety of scenarios and gives supervisors the confidence they need to handle difficult situations. Supervisors of CDL drivers cannot legally require a DOT Reasonable Suspicion Test without proof of training!

What we cover: Review 49 CFR Parts 40 & 382. Mandatory recognition training for alcohol and controlled substances.

How is it presented?: Power Point Slides, Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations - pocketbook version, Official DOT Interpretations of §382.307 and §382.603 and Reasonable Suspicion Observed Behavior Record.

AUDITING DRIVER'S LOGS AND TIMECARDS

Under the state and federal hours-of-service rules, failure to complete the record of duty status (driver's daily log), failure to preserve the record, or making false reports on the record is illegal, making both the driver and his/her carrier liable for prosecution. The best way to make sure logs are being kept properly is by performing a regular audit of drivers' logs.

This training program will cover the basics of efficiently and effectively auditing logs for drivers of property-carrying commercial motor vehicles.

Who should attend?: Drivers, owner-operators, managers, supervisors, safety directors and dispatchers.

What we cover: The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations and their interpretations and best practices for ensuring that your drivers records of duty status (logbook) are complete and accurate.

How is it presented?: Power Point, Hands-on inspection and audit of practice logs, Video & Handouts.

MANDATORY TRAINING FOR ENTRY-LEVEL CDL DRIVERS

The DOT has established standards for mandatory training requirements on four specific topics for entry-level operators of commercial motor vehicles who are required to hold or obtain a commercial driver's license (CDL). Drivers who are required to hold a CDL and have less than one year's experience in operating commercial motor vehicles in interstate commerce are subject to the training requirements.

What we cover: Driver Qualification, Hours of Service, Driver Wellness, Whistleblower Act.

How is it presented?: Power Point, Hands-on 49 CFR 391 & 395, and Handouts.

HOW TO COMPLETE VEHICLE PRE-TRIP INSPECTIONS and POST-TRIP REPORTS

This seminar will show your drivers - step by step, part by part - how to inspect their vehicles. Proper vehicle inspections can reduce the chances of accidents and breakdowns ... and their resulting costs. This training will convince your drivers that inspections need to be done before and after every trip ... and will show them the proper procedures.

Makes a strong case for vehicle inspections by reminding drivers that they and their company suffer from accidents and breakdowns. Walks drivers through a seven-step inspection process from the engine to the cab to the brakes. Reminds drivers of applicable DOT regulations. It stresses the importance of checking things in the same order every time to reduce the chance of forgetting something, and reminds drivers to fill out the DVIR each time, as well.

What we cover: The 7-Step Vehicle Inspection Procedure and Driver Vehicle Inspection Reports.

How is it presented?: Power Point, Hands-on Vehicle Inspection, 49 CFR 392, 393 & 396, & Handouts.

DEFENSIVE DRIVING, BACKING, EXTREME WEATHER, SPEED & SPACE MANAGEMENT, and HAZARD PERCEPTION

With this seminar, your drivers will get an overview of the elements critical to defensive driving - visual scanning, identifying and dealing with road hazards and road user hazards, and communicating clearly with other motorists. Attendees will discuss hazard perception and will be guided via video through a series of encounters or near-encounters - each followed by a "what-did-you-see/what-would-you-do" quiz question that forces drivers to think fast or face the consequences.
